A 21 days summer school on “Agricultural Education, Entrepreneurship And Skill Development In India” was sanctioned by ICAR on 16 July 2019 (F.No. Agrl.Edn./5/123/2018-HRD) with Dr. S. Basanta Singh as the course director with a sanction amount of Rs. 6,56,500 (Rupees Six lakhs and Fifty Six thousand Five Hundred only). The Directorate of Instruction, Central Agricultural University, Imphal organized the summer school from 27th August to 16th September, 2019.

1. India records a low 5 percent of workforce with formal vocational skills as compared to developed countries. With the increase in population there is increase in demand for food and agri produce but the supply is constant due to low agricultural productivity. Thus, there is requirement for specific set of skills in the field of agriculture. As per government focus on Doubling Farmers Income, the skill development of farmers and rural youth is of paramount importance. Agricultural Education played an important role towards development of entrepreneurial skills to provide employment and self reliance so that students developed confidence to start their own enterprise and turn job creators instead of job seekers. Thus the present training programme would help in fulfilling the desired objectives of increasing productivity, production and doubling of farm income. The main objective of organizing the summer school is to bridge the existing gaps between demand and supply of skill workforce who could expertise in the field of “Doubling of Farmers Income” through Skill development.

The brochure of the programme was uploaded in the CBP portal on 22nd July 2019. The last date for receipt of application was 19th August, 2019 with 20th August, 2019 being intimation of selection of participants. The last date for confirmation from participants was 24th August, 2019.

- Number of brochures mailed was around 200. In reply, 28 applications were received and amongst them 25 participants were selected based on screening. 2 participants dropped out and only 23 participants showed up on the first day and stayed up to the last day. All the 23 participants earned certificates from dignitaries on the dais in the valedictory function which was held on 16th Sept, 2019.
- Eligibility Criteria: the course was open for Scientist, Assistant Professor/Extension Specialist or equivalent and above working in Agricultural University/ ICAR Institute/KVKs. The participants must have a Masters degree in agriculture and allied subjects.
- Publicity of the summer school was done through telephone, internet, ICAR Website, social networking sites like facebook, whatsapp etc. before the end of the summer school, print and visual media were informed about the training programme. The opening ceremony and the valedictory function was covered by 11 media personnel. The programme was broadcasted by DDK, ISTV, TOM, IMPACT channels. All India Radio, Imphal also covered the programme. The news about the programme was printed in different newspapers like the Sangai Express, Poknapham, Imphal Free Press etc.

14. Course Directors Report:

The participants feedbacks were evaluated through their submission in CBP portal of the ICAR.

- (i) We have given various current and dynamic examples through many lectures to fulfill the requirements and all the participants expressed that the course were helpful and it provides platform for future networking and applications.
- (ii) 90% of the participants were very well satisfied with the general arrangement the school including the boarding and lodging facilities.
